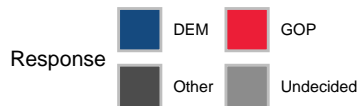
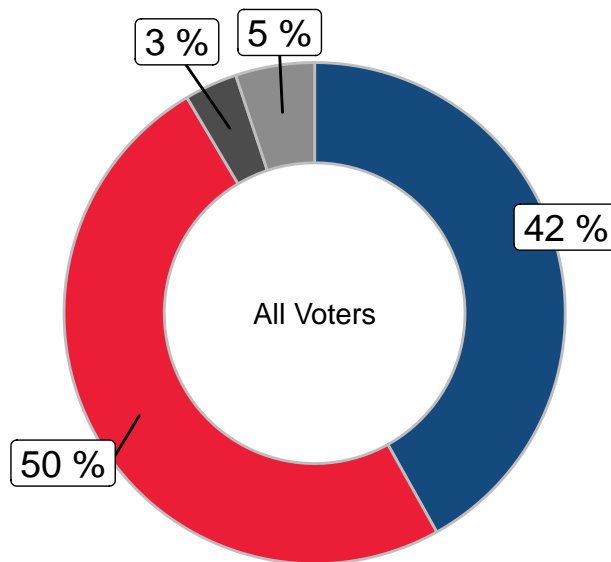
Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Thursday, April 13th to Friday, April 14th, 2023, among a sample of 1081 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Florida. The survey was conducted using live screener to automated telephone interviews (Smart IVR). The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Florida.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 3% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

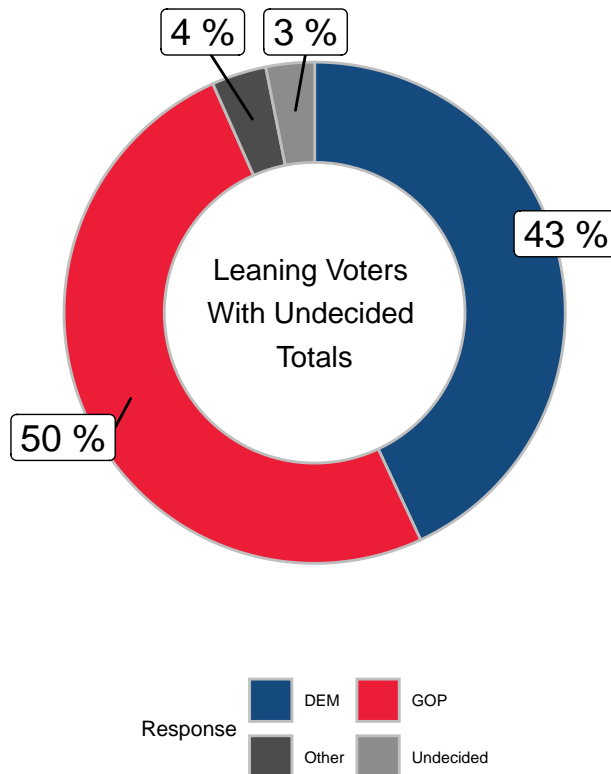

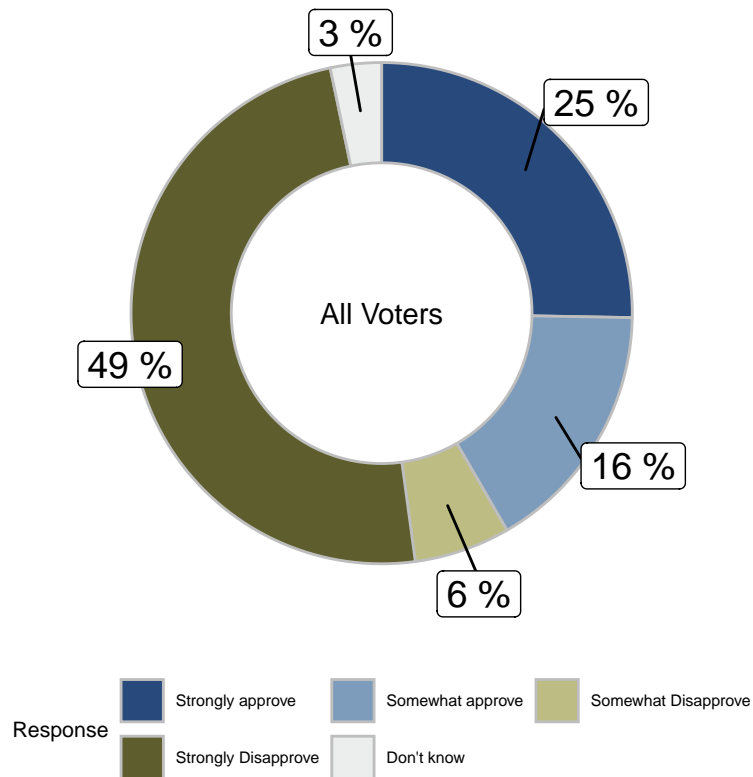

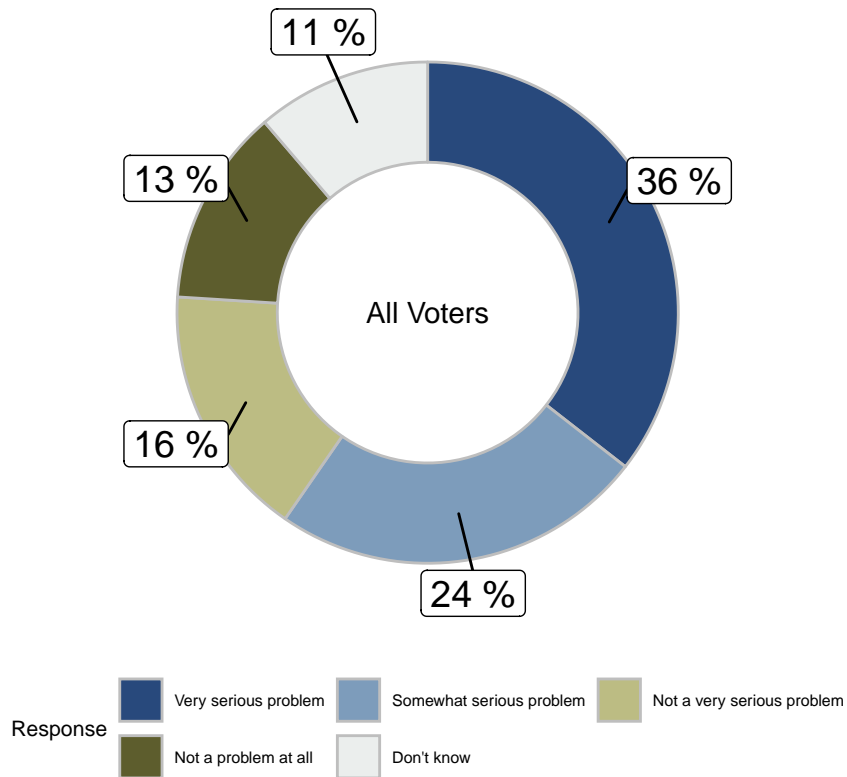
